Vanpool Guide

What is a Vanpool?

A vanpool is a group of commuters who share the ride to and from work in vans provided by RideFinders for a monthly fare, with each commuter serving in one of these roles:

- **Primary Driver:** May receive a FREE commute in exchange for driving, fueling, and administering the vanpool.
- **Riders:** Pay an equal monthly fare that covers the total monthly vanpool operating cost.
- **Back-up Driver:** Rider who drives the vanpool when the primary driver is unable to drive.

Vanpool Overview

- Fuel and Wash: Vanpools receive fleet cards to obtain car washes and purchase fuel.
- Insurance: Provided by RideFinders at or above statutory minimums for injury, property damage and uninsured motorists.
- Maintenance: Primary driver obtains basic maintenance using the Fleet card, while RideFinders performs extensive maintenance, repairs and inspections, and provides backup van if needed.
- Reporting: Drivers compile and submit daily vanpool mileage and ridership information on a monthly basis to RideFinders.
- Van Features: AM/FM stereo, power windows/locks, cruise control and front/rear air conditioning/heat/defroster are standard on all vehicles.
- Vanpool Fares: Riders pay a monthly fare that covers the total monthly vanpool operating cost, with no profit for RideFinders which consists of:
 - Lease Cost: Fixed cost for all administration, insurance and maintenance costs based on monthly commute mileage.
 - **Fuel Cost:** Variable cost based on current fuel prices and number of visits to the gas station each month.

Join an Existing Vanpool

- Click <u>Commuter Sign Up</u> to register with RideFinders free ridematching service or call (314) 621-7433.
- 2. Obtain a Vanpool Matchlist of existing vanpools with similar commutes to yours from the ridematching service.
- 3. Contact the primary drivers on your Vanpool Matchlist to discuss joining the vanpool.
- 4. If you are able to join the vanpool, complete a rider application provided by the primary driver and submit it to RideFinders.
- 5. Receive a Vanpool Rider Agreement, along with your determined monthly fare from RideFinders to complete, print and mail back as soon as possible.
- 6. Upon approval of the agreement and after paying your monthly fare, RideFinders will inform you and the primary driver that you may begin riding.

Start a New Vanpool

- Call (314) 621-7433 or email ridefinders@mct.org to request a Vanpool Application Packet and free "matchlist" of potential commuters for your vanpool.
- 2. Discuss the following with your potential vanpoolers:
 - Who will be the primary and back-up drivers?
 - What time will we leave for work and home?
 - What will be our pick-up and drop-off points?
 - How long do we wait for riders?
 - -How much will it cost to ride?
- 3. Once you have compiled the Vanpool Application Packet materials for the primary driver, five riders and at least one back-up driver, return the materials to RideFinders.
- 4. Upon approval of the primary and a back-up driver by RideFinders, the new vanpool may start as soon as the first weekday of the next month.

Vanpool Benefits

- Save Money: Primary drivers, and some Federal employees may be eligible for a vanpool subsidy from their employers to commute for free; all riders save hundreds or thousands of dollars in gas and other commute costs.
- Reduce Stress: Vanpool riders can sit back and enjoy the ride with time to read, work, sleep or relax without the stress of driving their own vehicle.
- **Ease Traffic:** Vanpools remove nearly 800 vehicles and 60,000 driving miles from our region's roadways daily easing traffic congestion for everyone.
- Improve Air Quality: By reducing the number of vehicles on the road, vanpooling helps eliminate over 2 million pounds of air pollution annually – allowing everyone to breathe easier.
- Guaranteed Peace of Mind: Vanpoolers receive up to four

 have to work late, or leave early, guaranteeing a way home with RideFinders
